**Bernadette Peters Joins Men Alive - The Orange County Gay Men's Chorus  
At Orange County Performing Arts Center on Saturday, May 31**

**Show Spotlights Music & Magic of New York City, Including Opera & Broadway**

*Two Performances at Orange County Performing Arts Center's Segerstrom Hall*

Broadway legend **Bernadette Peters** will join **Men Alive – The Orange County Gay Men's Chorus** in the Chorus' season finale *New York City Rhythm!* on Saturday, May 31 at the Orange County Performing Arts Center. The show will re-create the magic & music of New York City on stage in two performances at Orange County's largest and most prestigious venue, the 3000-seat Segerstrom Hall.

Throughout her illustrious career, Tony Award-winning actress Bernadette Peters has dazzled audiences and critics with her performances on stage, on television, in concert, and in the recording industry. In 2003, she received a record-breaking seventh Tony Award nomination, for her electrifying portrayal of Momma Rose in Sam Mendes' Broadway revival of *Gypsy*. And prior, she won the Tony Award and her third Drama Desk Award for her show-stopping portrayal of Annie Oakley in the smash hit Broadway revival of *Annie Get Your Gun* in 1999. She has starred in more than 10 Broadway musicals, and won two Tony Awards.

A New York native and a Broadway legend, Bernadette Peters was Men Alive's first choice for its guest star at its season finale celebrating the music & magic of the Big Apple. "She is truly the epitome of all things musical and wonderful about New York City," said Men Alive's artistic director, Rich Cook.

"New York is a center for just about every musical style imaginable, but it is especially well known for hosting the best of opera and for being the birthplace of musical theatre," said Cook. "Ms. Peters' stature as a Broadway icon will bring a unique authenticity to the Broadway music we will be performing together."

The 120 voice chorus will present the concert in its own unique style, with dancing and movement, hilarious skits, and unique approaches to traditional musical genres. Asked for concert highlights, Cook cited music from the long-running Broadway show *Dreamgirls*; a hilarious and unique approach to the "Figaro song" (Largo al Factotum) from *The Barber of Seville* by Rossini; another very funny song, "There! Right There!" from the current Broadway hit, *Legally Blonde*; and an important song for the lives of many gays & lesbians, "We Kiss in a Shadow," from Rogers & Hammerstein's *The King and I*.

The chorus will also feature its ensemble, Bel Canto, as well as a corps of dancers choreographed by Broadway veteran Michael Misita.

Men Alive – The Orange County Gay Men’s Chorus is in its seventh season of entertaining Orange County audiences. The chorus recently concluded performances of holiday and springs shows, *Holly Jolly Hollywood* and *Vegas Gold!* respectively at the Irvine Barclay Theatre. Men Alive will also travel to Miami this July to perform in the quadrennial Gay and Lesbian Association of Choruses festival.
